4 FOR the purpose of altering the requirements for certain regulations adopted by the
5 Office of Student Financial Assistance in the Maryland Higher Education
6 Commission relating to the implementation of the Janet L. Hoffman Loan
7 Assistance Repayment Program; and generally relating to modification of the
8 Janet L. Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article – Education**

1 18-1501.

2 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

3 (b) (1) “Eligible field of employment” means employment in the State by
4 an organization, institution, association, society, or corporation that is exempt from
5 taxation under § 501(c)(3) or (4) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

6 (2) “Eligible field of employment” includes employment by the State or
7 any local government in the State, but does not include being employed as a judicial
8 clerk in any court.

9 (c) “Higher education loan” means any loan for undergraduate or graduate
10 study that is obtained for tuition, educational expenses, or living expenses from:

11 (1) A college or university, government, or commercial source; or

12 (2) An organization, institution, association, society, or corporation
13 that is exempt from taxation under § 501(c)(3) or (4) of the Internal Revenue Code of
14 1986.

15 (d) “Program” means the Janet L. Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment
16 Program.

17 18-1502.

18 (a) There is a program of loan assistance repayment known as the Janet L.
19 Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program in the State.

20 (b) The Office of Student Financial Assistance shall assist in the repayment
21 of the amount of any higher education loan owed by an individual who:

22 (1) (i) Receives a graduate, professional, or undergraduate degree
23 from:

24 1. A college or university in the State of Maryland; or

25 2. A school of law; or

26 (ii) Receives a Resident Teacher Certificate (RTC) from the
27 Department after completing an alternative teaching preparation program approved
28 by the State Superintendent;

29 (2) Obtains eligible employment;

1 (3) Receives an income that is less than the maximum eligible total
2 income levels established by the Office, including any additional sources of income;
3 and

4 (4) Satisfies any other criteria established by the Office.

5 (c) Subject to the provisions of subsection (b) of this section, the Office shall
6 assist in the repayment of the amount of any higher education loan owed by a public
7 school teacher in the State who:

8 (1) Has taught in Maryland for at least 2 years:

9 (i) In science, technology, engineering, or math subjects; or

10 (ii) In a school in which at least 75% of the students are enrolled
11 in the free and reduced lunch program in the State; and

12 (2) Has received the highest performance evaluation rating for the
13 most recent year available in the county in which the teacher taught.

14 (d) (1) A grant awarded under subsection (c) of this section shall be
15 known as the Nancy Grasmick Teacher Award.

16 (2) A recipient of a Nancy Grasmick Teacher Award shall be known as
17 a Nancy Grasmick Teacher Scholar.

18 (e) An applicant for assistance in the repayment of a commercial loan shall
19 demonstrate to the Office that the commercial loan was used for tuition, educational
20 expenses, or living expenses for graduate or undergraduate study.

21 (f) Assistance in the repayment of a loan from an entity set forth in §
22 18–1501(c)(2) of this subtitle shall require the approval of the Office.

23 18–1503.

24 (a) The Office of Student Financial Assistance shall adopt regulations to
25 establish:

26 (1) The maximum starting income for eligibility in the Janet L.
27 Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program;

28 (2) The maximum total income for eligibility in the Janet L. Hoffman
29 Loan Assistance Repayment Program, including any additional sources of income;

30 (3) That priority for participation in the Program shall be given to an
31 individual who:

1 (i) Graduated from an institution of higher education in the
2 last 3 years;

3 (ii) Is a resident of the State;

4 (iii) Is employed on a full-time basis; and

5 (iv) 1. Provides, as the principal part of the individual's
6 employment, legal services to low-income residents in the State who cannot afford
7 legal services, nursing services in nursing shortage areas in the State as defined in §
8 18-802 of this title, or other services in an eligible field of employment in which there
9 is a shortage of qualified practitioners to low-income or underserved residents or
10 areas of the State; or

11 2. For teacher applicants only, qualifies for a Nancy
12 Grasmick Teacher Award;

13 (4) A limit on the total amount of assistance provided by the Office of
14 Student Financial Assistance in repaying the loan of an eligible individual, based on
15 the individual's total income and outstanding higher education loan balance;

16 (5) A procedure and schedule for the **MONTHLY OR ANNUAL** payment
17 of the amount of loan assistance provided by the Office of Student Financial
18 Assistance to the eligible individual, **AS APPROPRIATE TO ASSIST AN ELIGIBLE**
19 **INDIVIDUAL IN MEETING LOAN FORGIVENESS PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS; [and]**

20 **(6) A REQUIREMENT THAT AN ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL APPLY TO**
21 **FEDERAL LOAN FORGIVENESS PROGRAMS FOR WHICH THE INDIVIDUAL MAY**
22 **QUALIFY;**

23 **(7) A REQUIREMENT THAT AN ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL NOTIFY THE**
24 **OFFICE OF STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE IF THE INDIVIDUAL RECEIVES**
25 **OTHER LOAN REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE; AND**

26 **[(6)] (8)** An annual review of the eligibility of each individual
27 participating in the Program.

28 (b) The Office of Student Financial Assistance may not approve more than
29 50% of the total number of awards for teacher applicants to Nancy Grasmick Teacher
30 Scholars.

31 (c) The Office of Student Financial Assistance shall adopt any other
32 regulations necessary to implement this subtitle.

33 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
34 July 1, 2014.
