A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Education - Task Force to Study the Suspension of Prekindergarten Students in Public Schools

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study the Suspension of $\mathbf{5}$ Prekindergarten Students in Public Schools; providing for the composition, 6 chair, and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force $\overline{7}$ from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of 8 certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study and make recommendations 9 regarding certain matters; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and 10 recommendations to the Governor and certain committees of the General 11 Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study the Suspension of 12Prekindergarten Students in Public Schools. 13

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That:

16 (a) There is a Task Force to Study the Suspension of Prekindergarten17 Students in Public Schools.

18 (b) The Task Force consists of the following 11 members:

19 (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the 20 President of the Senate;

21 (2) two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker 22 of the House;

23 (3) the State Superintendent of Schools, or the State Superintendent's
24 designee;

5 (g) On or before December 31, 2014, the Task Force shall report its findings 6 and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State 7 Government Article, the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs 8 Committee and the House Committee on Ways and Means.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 June 1, 2014. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31, 11 2015, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be 12 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
