2 Vehicle Laws – Prohibition Against Smoking in Vehicle Containing Young 3 Child

FOR the purpose of prohibiting the driver of a motor vehicle in which a person who is
under a certain age is a passenger from smoking a tobacco product or allowing a
passenger to smoke in the motor vehicle; establishing a penalty for a violation of
this Act; providing that a violation of this Act is not a moving violation for
certain purposes; providing for the application of this Act; defining a certain
term; and generally relating to prohibitions against tobacco smoking in a motor
vehicle.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Transportation

20 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "SMOKING" MEANS THE BURNING OF A LIGHTED 21 CIGARETTE, CIGAR, PIPE, OR ANY OTHER DEVICE OR SUBSTANCE THAT 22 CONTAINS TOBACCO.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1(B) THE DRIVER OF A MOTOR VEHICLE IN WHICH A PERSON WHO IS2UNDER THE AGE OF 8 YEARS IS A PASSENGER MAY NOT ENGAGE IN SMOKING OR3ALLOW A PASSENGER TO ENGAGE IN SMOKING IN THE MOTOR VEHICLE.

4 (C) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A MOBILE HOME WHEN THE 5 MOBILE HOME IS BEING USED AS A PERMANENT OR TEMPORARY LIVING OR 6 SLEEPING PLACE AND NOT A CONVEYANCE ON HIGHWAYS.

7 (D) A VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION IS NOT A MOVING VIOLATION FOR 8 PURPOSES OF § 16–402 OF THIS ARTICLE.

10ANY PERSON CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION OF § 21–1130 OF THIS ARTICLE11IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$50.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2014.
