A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Courts – Aggravated Murder Court

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the General Assembly to create an Aggravated 4 Murder Court that shall have original and exclusive jurisdiction over all $\mathbf{5}$ presentments or indictments for offenses previously punishable by death; 6 vesting the judicial power of the State in the Aggravated Murder Court as the 7 General Assembly may create by law; providing that the judges of the 8 Aggravated Murder Court that may be created may not be elected in a certain 9 manner; requiring certain presentments or indictments to be transmitted to the Aggravated Murder Court that may be created; requiring the Attorney General 10 to prosecute certain presentments or indictments pending in the Aggravated 11 12Murder Court that may be created; and submitting this amendment to the 13 qualified voters of the State for their adoption or rejection.

23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 24 MARYLAND, (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses 25 concurring), That it be proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

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Article IV – Judiciary Department

The Judicial power of this State is vested in a Court of Appeals, such intermediate courts of appeal as the General Assembly may create by law, AN **AGGRAVATED MURDER COURT AS THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY CREATE BY LAW,** Circuit Courts, Orphans' Courts, and a District Court. These Courts shall be Courts of Record, and each shall have a seal to be used in the authentication of all process issuing from it.

9 Except for the Judges of the District Court AND THE AGGRAVATED MURDER 10 **COURT**, the Judges of the several Courts other than the Court of Appeals or any 11 intermediate courts of appeal shall, subject to the provisions of Section 5 of this Article of the Constitution, be elected in Baltimore City and in each county, by the qualified 1213 voters of the city and of each county, respectively, all of the said Judges to be elected at the general election to be held on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 14as now provided for in the Constitution. Each of the said Judges shall hold his office 1516for the term of fifteen years from the time of his election, and until his successor is 17elected and qualified, or until he shall have attained the age of seventy years, 18 whichever may first happen, and be reeligible thereto until he shall have attained the age of seventy years, and not after. In case of the inability of any of said Judges to 19 20discharge his duties with efficiency, by reason of continued sickness, or of physical or 21mental infirmity, it shall be in the power of the General Assembly, two-thirds of the 22members of each House concurring, with the approval of the Governor to retire said 23Judge from office.

25(b)In all cases of presentments or indictments for offenses that are 26punishable by death, on suggestion in writing under oath of either of the parties to the 27proceedings that the party cannot have a fair and impartial trial in the court in which 28the proceedings may be pending, the court shall order and direct the record of 29proceedings in the presentment or indictment to be transmitted to some other court 30 having jurisdiction in such case for trial, OR IF AN AGGRAVATED MURDER COURT HAS BEEN CREATED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, ANY SUCH CASE SHALL BE 3132IMMEDIATELY TRANSMITTED TO THE AGGRAVATED MURDER COURT.

Investigate, commence, and prosecute or defend any civil or (2)criminal suit or action or category of such suits or actions in any of the Federal Courts or in any Court of this State, or before administrative agencies and quasi legislative bodies, on the part of the State or in which the State may be interested, which the General Assembly by law or joint resolution, or the Governor, shall have directed or shall direct to be investigated, commenced and prosecuted or defended. When required by the General Assembly by law or joint resolution, (3)or by the Governor, aid any State's Attorney or other authorized prosecuting officer in investigating, commencing, and prosecuting any criminal suit or action or category of such suits or actions brought by the State in any Court of this State. 23Give his opinion in writing whenever required by the General (4)24Assembly or either branch thereof, the Governor, the Comptroller, the Treasurer or 25any State's Attorney on any legal matter or subject. 26**PROSECUTE ON THE PART OF THE STATE ALL PRESENTMENTS** (5)

27OR INDICTMENTS FOR OFFENSES THAT WERE PUNISHABLE BY DEATH UNDER FORMER § 2–303 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE THAT ARE PENDING IN THE 2829AGGRAVATED MURDER COURT AS THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY CREATE BY 30 LAW.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly 3132determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by this Act 33 affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the 34Maryland Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not 35apply.

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SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section 1 $\mathbf{2}$ proposed as an amendment to the Maryland Constitution shall be submitted to the 3 qualified voters of the State at the next general election to be held in November 2014 4 for their adoption or rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. $\mathbf{5}$ At that general election, the vote on this proposed amendment to the Constitution 6 shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the 7Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now 8 provided by law. Immediately after the election, all returns shall be made to the 9 Governor of the vote for and against the proposed amendment, as directed by Article 10 XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and further proceedings had in accordance with Article XIV. 11
