## 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 **Professional Land Surveyors – Licensure Qualifications – Revisions**

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain applicants for a license to practice land 4 surveying to apply for a license on or before a certain date to qualify for  $\mathbf{5}$ licensure with certain qualifications; altering certain educational, experiential, 6 and examination requirements for a license to practice land surveying; authorizing the Board of Professional Land Surveyors to waive or require 7 8 certain applicants for a license to practice land surveying in the State to pass 9 certain examination requirements; making certain stylistic changes; and 10 generally relating to revisions to licensure gualifications for professional land 11 surveyors.
