A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

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Correctional Officers' Retirement System - Membership

3 FOR the purpose of altering the positions eligible for membership in the Correctional 4 Officers' Retirement System; clarifying that certain individuals who do not elect 5 to transfer are not members of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System; 6 authorizing certain individuals to cease membership in the Employees' Pension 7 System and enroll in the Correctional Officers' Retirement System; authorizing 8 certain individuals to transfer service credit from the Employees' Pension 9 System to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System; requiring an individual 10 who elects to transfer membership and service credit to the Correctional 11 Officers' Retirement System to make that election on a form provided by the 12 Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System; requiring service credit transferred to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System under 13 this Act to be transferred in accordance with certain provisions of law; requiring 14 15 the Executive Director of the State Retirement Agency to grant a certain waiver 16 if it is necessary to implement a certain transfer of service credit; providing for 17 the termination of certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to 18 membership in the Correctional Officers' Retirement System.

27 28 29	(b) On retirement under this section, a member is entitled to receive a normal service retirement allowance that equals one fifty—fifth of the member's average final compensation multiplied by the number of years of creditable service.

- (2) on July 1, 2014, continues employment as a correctional officer serving as a security chief, a facility administrator, an assistant warden, or a warden.
- 6 (b) (1) On or after July 1, 2014, but on or before December 31, 2014, an individual described in subsection (a) of this section may cease membership in the Employees' Pension System and be enrolled as a member of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System.
- 10 (2) An individual who enrolls as a member of the Correctional Officers' 11 Retirement System under paragraph (1) of this subsection may transfer service credit 12 from the Employees' Pension System to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System.
- 13 (3) (i) An individual who chooses to enroll in the Correctional 14 Officers' Retirement System under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall do so by filing 15 an application provided by the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension 16 System.
- 17 (ii) An individual who chooses to transfer service credit to the 18 Correctional Officers' Retirement System under paragraph (2) of this subsection shall 19 do so by filing an application provided by the Board of Trustees for the State 20 Retirement and Pension System.
 - (4) (i) Service credit transferred under paragraph (2) of this subsection shall be transferred in the same manner as a transfer of service credit made in accordance with Title 37 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article.
 - (ii) The Executive Director of the State Retirement Agency shall grant a waiver under § 37–203.2 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article if a waiver is necessary to transfer service credit under paragraph (2) of this subsection.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2014. Section 2 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 6 months and, at the end of December 31, 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly, Section 2 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
