1 AN ACT concerning

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Drones – Unauthorized Surveillance

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a law enforcement agency from using a drone to gather 4 evidence or other information except under certain circumstances; authorizing $\mathbf{5}$ an aggrieved party to initiate a certain civil action against a law enforcement 6 agency; prohibiting a person or certain agency from using a drone to conduct 7 surveillance or observation of a certain individual or property except under 8 certain circumstances; authorizing an aggrieved party to initiate a certain civil 9 action to prevent or remedy a violation of this Act; establishing that evidence 10 collected in violation of this Act is not admissible as evidence in a certain 11 proceeding in the State; defining certain terms; providing for the construction of this Act; and generally relating to unauthorized surveillance by drones. 12
