1 AN ACT concerning

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Joint Committee on Ending Homelessness

3 FOR the purpose of creating a Joint Committee on Ending Homelessness; specifying 4 the membership of the Committee; providing that members of the Committee $\mathbf{5}$ serve at the pleasure of the appointing officer; providing for the appointment of 6 cochairmen of the Committee; establishing that a majority of the full authorized 7 membership of the Committee is a quorum; providing staff for the Committee; 8 requiring the Committee to hold certain meetings; authorizing the Committee to 9 hold certain hearings and consider certain votes on certain bills or resolutions; 10 establishing the powers and duties of the Committee; requiring the Governor's 11 Interagency Council on Homelessness to cooperate fully with the Committee, keep the Committee fully informed as to the Council's priorities and progress, 12and submit a certain report to the Committee on or before a certain date each 13 14year; requiring the Committee to submit a certain report to the General 15Assembly by a certain date each year; and generally relating to the Joint 16 Committee on Ending Homelessness.
