## 1 AN ACT concerning

## Anne Arundel County – State's Attorney and Deputy, Assistant, and Temporary Assistant State's Attorneys – Annual Salary and Compensation

- 4 FOR the purpose of altering, beginning on a certain date and under certain  $\mathbf{5}$ circumstances, the annual salary of the State's Attorney for Anne Arundel 6 County; providing that the State's Attorney may set certain salaries and 7 compensation subject to the approval of the county council; providing for the 8 application of this Act; making a stylistic change; and generally relating to the 9 salary and compensation of the State's Attorney, deputy State's Attorneys, assistant State's Attorneys, and temporary assistant State's Attorneys for Anne 10 Arundel County. 11

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III, § 35 of the Maryland Constitution, this Act may not be construed to extend or apply to the salary or compensation of the State's Attorney for Anne Arundel County while serving in a term of office beginning before the effective date of this Act, but the provisions of this Act concerning the salary or compensation of the State's Attorney for Anne Arundel County shall take effect at the beginning of the next following term of office. This limitation does not apply to an individual appointed or elected after the effective date of this Act to fill out an unexpired term.

- October 1, 2014.
