- 19 (A) EACH HOSPITAL THAT PROVIDES EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES 20 SHALL PROVIDE A SEXUAL ASSAULT MEDICAL FORENSIC EXAMINATION BY A
- 21 FORENSIC NURSE EXAMINER TO A VICTIM OF AN ALLEGED RAPE OR SEXUAL
- 22 OFFENSE WHO ARRIVES AT THE HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT.
