17 18	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

$21 \\ 22 \\ 23$	(a) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person who violates a watershed regulation adopted under § $17-403$ of this article has committed a Commission infraction.

1 2	(2) A Commission infraction does not include a violation of a watershed regulation declared by law to be a criminal offense.
3	(3) The Commission may:
4 5	(i) establish a schedule of preset fines for each conviction of a Commission infraction under this section;
6 7	(ii) impose a preset fine not to exceed [\$50] \$250 for each conviction of a Commission infraction under this section; and
8 9	(iii) impose a preset fine not to exceed [\$100] \$500 for a repeat offense.
10 11	(4) The recipient of a citation for a Commission infraction shall pay the fine to the Commission within 20 calendar days after the receipt of the citation.

14	(1) [\$50] \$250 for a first offense; or
15	(2) [\$100] \$500 for a repeat offense.
