## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Public Health - Hydraulic Fracturing Chemicals - Information and Fund

3 FOR the purpose of requiring an applicant for a certain permit for the hydraulic fracturing of a well for the exploration or production of natural gas to submit 4 5 certain information to the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene in a 6 certain manner; requiring the Department to provide access to certain 7 information to the Maryland Poison Control Center and certain health care 8 providers; authorizing a certain health care provider to provide certain 9 information in a certain manner; requiring a certain health care provider, 10 health professional, or government agency to maintain information and medical 11 records in a certain manner; requiring the Department to establish a certain 12 educational program for certain purposes; establishing the Hydraulic Fracturing Chemical Education and Impact Fund as a special, nonlapsing fund; 13 14 specifying the purpose of the Fund; requiring the Department to administer the 15 Fund; requiring the State Treasurer to hold the Fund and the Comptroller to 16 account for the Fund; specifying the contents of the Fund; specifying the 17 purpose for which the Fund may be used; providing for the investment of money 18 in and expenditures from the Fund; requiring the Department to establish a certain fee by regulation; establishing a certain civil penalty for certain 19 20 violations; requiring the Department to adopt certain regulations; defining 21 certain terms; and generally relating to chemicals used in hydraulic fracturing.

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

THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO ADDRESS THE POTENTIAL 3 (B) ASSOCIATED WITH CHEMICALS USED IN HYDRAULIC 4 HEALTH RISKS 5 FRACTURING. 6 (C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADMINISTER THE FUND. THE FUND IS A SPECIAL, NONLAPSING FUND THAT IS NOT 7 (D) **(1)** SUBJECT TO § 7-302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE. 8 9 **(2)** THE STATE TREASURER SHALL HOLD THE **FUND** SEPARATELY, AND THE COMPTROLLER SHALL ACCOUNT FOR THE FUND. 10 11 **(E)** THE FUND CONSISTS OF: **(1)** REVENUE DISTRIBUTED TO THE FUND UNDER § 22–705 OF 12 13 THIS SUBTITLE; 14 **(2)** PENALTIES COLLECTED UNDER § 22–706 OF THIS SUBTITLE; MONEY APPROPRIATED IN THE STATE BUDGET TO THE FUND; 15 **(3)** 16 ANY INVESTMENT EARNINGS OF THE FUND; AND **(4)** 17 **(5)** ANY OTHER MONEY FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE ACCEPTED 18 FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE FUND.

- 20 (1) FINANCING AN EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM REQUIRED UNDER § 21 22–703 OF THIS SUBTITLE;
- 22 (2) PROVIDING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO A PERSON THAT HAS 23 AN ILLNESS OR INJURY CAUSED BY A CHEMICAL USED IN HYDRAULIC 24 FRACTURING; AND
- 25 (3) THE REASONABLE COSTS OF ADMINISTERING THE FUND.
- 26 (G) (1) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL INVEST THE MONEY OF THE 27 FUND IN THE SAME MANNER AS OTHER STATE MONEY MAY BE INVESTED.
