- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

7 (h) If a public safety employee is awarded compensation for less than 75 8 weeks, the employer or its insurer shall pay the public safety employee compensation 9 at the rate set for an award of compensation for a period greater than or equal to 75 10 weeks but less than 250 weeks under § 9–629 of this subtitle.

12 If a covered employee is awarded compensation for a period equal to or greater 13 than 75 weeks but less than 250 weeks, the employer or its insurer shall pay the 14 covered employee weekly compensation that equals two-thirds of the average weekly 15 wage of the covered employee but does not exceed one-third of the State average 16 weekly wage.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be 18 construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have 19 any effect on or application to any claims arising before the effective date of this Act.

20 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 21 October 1, 2014.
