# A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 Transportation – Highway User Revenues – Local Government Reporting

FOR the purpose of requiring each county and each municipality that receives 3 4 highway user revenues to submit a report on or before a certain date each year  $\mathbf{5}$ to the State Highway Administration, the Governor, and certain committees of 6 the General Assembly that documents the actual costs and lawful uses of 7 highway user revenues in the preceding fiscal year and the expenditure budget 8 of the current fiscal year; repealing obsolete language; and generally relating to 9 requiring local governments to report on their expenditures of highway user 10 revenues.

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

11 It is the policy of this State that bicycle trails are important and their (a) construction is encouraged wherever feasible. 12

13 To establish and maintain footpaths, bridle paths or horse trails, and (b)14bicycle trails:

15Baltimore City, any county, or any municipality that receives (1)highway user revenues may spend a reasonable part of its net share for these 1617purposes; and

22On or before January 1 of each year, Baltimore City, EACH COUNTY, AND EACH ELIGIBLE MUNICIPALITY THAT RECEIVED HIGHWAY USER REVENUES IN 23THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR shall [give to the Governor and] SUBMIT to the 24Administration, THE GOVERNOR, AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE 2526STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE SENATE BUDGET AND TAXATION COMMITTEE, THE HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE, AND THE HOUSE 27WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE an accounting report that: 28
