AN ACT concerning
Howard County - Alcoholic Beverages - Population Restriction on Class A Licenses
Ho. Co. 1–14
FOR the purpose of limiting the number of Class A licenses of any type that the Board of License Commissioners of Howard County may issue based on a certain license—to—population ratio using County population data, as determined by the latest federal census; providing a certain exception; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Howard County.
BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages Section 9–214(a) Annotated Code of Maryland (2011 Replacement Volume and 2013 Supplement)
BY adding to Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages Section 9–214(f) Annotated Code of Maryland (2011 Replacement Volume and 2013 Supplement)
SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages
9–214.
(a) This section applies only in Howard County.

 9 RETAIL SPACE.
