 makes certain determinations; requiring Baltimore City to consider certain
 factors in enacting an ordinance under this Act; and generally relating to
 stopping, standing, and parking a vehicle in Baltimore City.

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 20 Article Transportation
- 21 21–1003.

(a) The provisions of this section apply except as necessary to avoid conflict
 with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or
 traffic control device.

APPLIES TO A ROADWAY DESIGNATED IN THE $\mathbf{5}$ **ORDINANCE; AND** 6 2.
