CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Health Occupations - Massage Therapy - Authority to Practice

FOR the purpose of requiring applicants for a license or registration from the State Board of Chiropractic and Massage Therapy Examiners to submit to a certain criminal history records check; requiring certain applicants to submit certain fingerprints and certain fees to the Criminal Justice Information System Central Repository of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services under certain circumstances; requiring the Central Repository to forward certain information to the Board and to certain applicants; providing that certain information is confidential and may be used only for certain purposes; authorizing the subject of a certain criminal history records check to contest the contents of a certain statement; requiring an individual to be registered by the State Board of Chiropractic and Massage Therapy Examiners before the individual may practice massage therapy in a certain setting; requiring an applicant for a certain license to have submitted to a certain eriminal history records check to qualify for a license; altering certain educational requirements an applicant for a license to practice massage therapy must meet to qualify for a license; requiring an applicant for a certain registration to have submitted to a certain criminal history records check to qualify for a registration; altering certain educational requirements an applicant for a registration to practice massage in a certain setting must meet to qualify for registration; requiring the Board to issue a license or registration to an applicant who pays a certain fee and meets certain requirements; requiring the Board to include certain information on each license and registration that the Board issues; requiring the Board to consider certain
