## A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

### Health - Food Allergy Awareness

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring a food establishment, beginning on a certain date, to 4 request that a customer inform the employee taking the customer's food order of  $\mathbf{5}$ any known food allergies before ordering; providing that the request may be 6 included on a menu or menu board or made by the employee taking the 7 customer's food order; requiring a food establishment, beginning on a certain 8 date, to have on the premises at certain times an employee who has completed a 9 certain training course, passed a certain test, and is available to discuss meal options with certain customers; providing that a food establishment that is 10 required under local law to have a food service manager on the premises 11 12satisfies a certain provision of this Act under certain circumstances; requiring 13 the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to make available on its Web site a list of certain food allergen awareness training courses and tests and a list 1415of certain resources; and generally relating to food allergy awareness.

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article – Health – General

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1 (a) (1) Beginning March 1, 2014, a food establishment shall display 2 prominently in the staff area of the food establishment a poster relating to food allergy 3 awareness that includes information regarding the risk of an allergic reaction.

[(b)] (2) On or before January 1, 2014, the Department, in consultation with the Restaurant Association of Maryland and Food Allergy Research and Education, shall create and make available on its Web site the poster required to be displayed under [subsection (a) of this section] PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

9 (B) (1) BEGINNING ON MARCH 1, 2015, A FOOD ESTABLISHMENT 10 SHALL REQUEST THAT A CUSTOMER INFORM THE EMPLOYEE TAKING THE 11 CUSTOMER'S FOOD ORDER OF ANY KNOWN FOOD ALLERGIES BEFORE 12 ORDERING.

13(2) THE REQUEST REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH(1) OF THIS14SUBSECTION MAY BE:

15(I)INCLUDED ON THE FOOD ESTABLISHMENT'S MENU OR16MENU BOARD; OR

17(II) MADE BY THE EMPLOYEE TAKING THE CUSTOMER'S18FOOD ORDER.

19 (C) (1) BEGINNING ON MARCH 1, 2015, A FOOD ESTABLISHMENT 20 SHALL HAVE ON THE PREMISES AT ALL TIMES WHEN FOOD IS BEING PREPARED 21 OR SERVED AN EMPLOYEE WHO:

(I) HAS COMPLETED A FOOD ALLERGEN AWARENESS
TRAINING COURSE AND PASSED AN ACCREDITED TEST APPROVED BY THE
DEPARTMENT; AND

25 (II) IS AVAILABLE TO DISCUSS MEAL OPTIONS WITH 26 CUSTOMERS WHO HAVE FOOD ALLERGIES.

(2) A FOOD ESTABLISHMENT THAT IS REQUIRED UNDER LOCAL
LAW TO HAVE A FOOD SERVICE MANAGER ON THE PREMISES SATISFIES THE
REQUIREMENT OF PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION IF THE FOOD SERVICE
MANAGER HAS COMPLETED A FOOD ALLERGEN AWARENESS TRAINING COURSE
APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

32 (D) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL MAKE AVAILABLE ON ITS WEB SITE:

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1 (1) A LIST OF APPROVED THIRD-PARTY ONLINE AND IN-PERSON 2 FOOD ALLERGEN AWARENESS TRAINING COURSES AND ACCREDITED TESTS; 3 AND

4 (2) A LIST OF RESOURCES ABOUT FOOD SAFETY AND FOOD 5 HANDLING AS THEY RELATE TO FOOD ALLERGIES.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2014.
