1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 Public Health – Dog Bites – Proof of Rabies Vaccination Required

- FOR the purpose of requiring the owner of a dog that bites a human to provide to the
  individual who was bitten by the dog certain proof that the dog has been
  adequately vaccinated against rabies; establishing a certain civil penalty; and
  generally relating to dog bites and proof of rabies vaccination.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(a) Each person who owns or keeps a dog, cat, or ferret that is 4 months old
or older shall have the dog, cat, or ferret vaccinated adequately against rabies.

1 (3) A LICENSE OR REGISTRATION ISSUED BY A COUNTY THAT 2 INDICATES THE DOG HAS BEEN ADEQUATELY VACCINATED AGAINST RABIES.

3 (C) A PERSON WHO FAILS TO PROVIDE PROOF OF A RABIES 4 VACCINATION AS REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY 5 OF \$100.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2014.
