# Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation – Youth Apprenticeship Advisory Committee

- FOR the purpose of establishing the Youth Apprenticeship Advisory Committee in the
  Division of Labor and Industry; providing for the composition and duties of the
  Committee; requiring the Committee to submit a certain report to the General
  Assembly on or before a certain date each year; defining a certain term; and
  generally relating to the Youth Apprenticeship Advisory Committee.

### 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 17 **11–409.**

### 18 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "COMMITTEE" MEANS THE YOUTH 19 APPRENTICESHIP ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

### 20 (B) THERE IS A YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP ADVISORY COMMITTEE IN 21 THE DIVISION OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY.

22 (C) THE COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:

25	(D) THE COMMITTEE SHALL:
26 27 28	(1) EVALUATE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF EXISTING HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS IN THE STATE, OTHER STATES, AND OTHER COUNTRIES BASED ON A SYSTEMATIC REVIEW OF SPECIFIED DATA;

(2) **REVIEW AND IDENTIFY:** 

2 (I) WAYS TO IMPLEMENT HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH 3 APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS IN THE STATE; AND

4 (II) MEANS THROUGH WHICH EMPLOYERS AND 5 ORGANIZATIONS CAN OBTAIN GRANTS, TAX CREDITS, AND OTHER SUBSIDIES TO 6 SUPPORT ESTABLISHMENT AND OPERATION OF HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH 7 APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS; AND

8 (3) SET TARGETS FOR THE NUMBER OF APPRENTICESHIP 9 OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH THAT THE STATE SHOULD REACH OVER THE NEXT 10 3 YEARS.

11 **(E)** ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE COMMITTEE SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE 12GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY REGARDING ANY 13LEGISLATION PROMOTE 14RECOMMENDED TO HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS IN THE STATE. 15

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2014.
