- FOR the purpose of requiring a law enforcement officer to provide or recite a certain statement of rights to an individual detained at a traffic stop before the law enforcement officer searches the individual or the property or vehicle of the individual; prohibiting a law enforcement officer from posting or displaying a certain deceptive, false, or misleading sign on a highway; defining certain terms; and generally relating to law enforcement procedures, traffic stops, and safety checkpoints.

1 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE 2 MEANINGS INDICATED.

3 (2) "LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN
4 § 3–101 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE.

5 (3) "TRAFFIC STOP" MEANS ANY INSTANCE WHEN A LAW 6 ENFORCEMENT OFFICER STOPS THE DRIVER OF A MOTOR VEHICLE AND 7 DETAINS THE DRIVER FOR ANY PERIOD OF TIME FOR A VIOLATION OF THE 8 MARYLAND VEHICLE LAW.

9 (B) IF A STATE OR LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER DETAINS AN 10 INDIVIDUAL AT A TRAFFIC STOP, BEFORE THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER 11 SEARCHES THE INDIVIDUAL OR THE PROPERTY OR VEHICLE OF THE 12 INDIVIDUAL, THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER SHALL PROVIDE OR RECITE A 13 STATEMENT OF THE INDIVIDUAL'S RIGHTS TO THE INDIVIDUAL.

20 (3) "SAFETY CHECKPOINT" MEANS A PREDETERMINED FIXED 21 LOCATION AT WHICH A POLICE OFFICER STOPS A MOTOR VEHICLE OR A 22 SPECIFIC SEQUENCE OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO CONDUCT SAFETY INSPECTIONS, 23 CHECK DRIVERS' LICENSES AND REGISTRATIONS, AND EVALUATE DRIVERS FOR 24 IMPAIRMENT.

(B) A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER MAY NOT POST OR DISPLAY A
DECEPTIVE, MATERIALLY FALSE, OR MISLEADING SIGN CONCERNING A SAFETY
CHECKPOINT ON A HIGHWAY.
