- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain volunteer firefighters acting as fire police to 4 have their privately owned vehicles equipped with red lights or signal devices 5 and to display the lights or signal devices while en route to or at the scene of an 6 emergency; repealing a certain limit on the number of certain members of a 7 volunteer fire company whose personal vehicles may be equipped with and 8 display certain lights; making certain stylistic changes; and generally relating 9 to signal devices on the personal vehicles of volunteer firefighters acting as fire 10 police.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 (c) (3) (i) Vehicles of city, county, State, or federal fire departments or 21 duly constituted volunteer fire departments or rescue squads, or the Maryland 22 Institute for Emergency Medical Services System, may be equipped with or display red
- and/or white lights or signal devices.
