Health - Reporting of Death and Burial or Disposal of Body - Requirements and Penalties

FOR the purpose of requiring certain individuals who have personal knowledge of the
death of another individual or who have personally discovered a body to provide
certain notice of the death within a certain time period to a certain law
enforcement officer, physician, or 9-1-1 system; prohibiting an individual from
burying or disposing of a body except in a certain manner; establishing certain
penalties; and generally relating to reporting a death and burying or disposing
of a body.
