- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to adopt 5 regulations, on or before a certain date, that establish certification criteria and 6 reimbursement and payment policies for community health workers; requiring 7 the Department, if applicable, to receive certain approval from the federal 8 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services; requiring the Department and the 9 Maryland Insurance Administration to establish a certain stakeholder workgroup; requiring the workgroup to conduct a certain study and make 10 certain recommendations; requiring the workgroup to report its findings and 11 12 recommendations to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to community health workers. 13

6 7 8 9	(C) IF APPLICABLE, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SEEK ANY APPROVAL NECESSARY FROM THE FEDERAL CENTERS FOR MEDICARE AND MEDICAID SERVICES TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT TO REIMBURSE COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKERS FOR PROVIDING PREVENTIVE SERVICES.
10	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
11 12 13	(a) The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and the Maryland Insurance Administration shall establish a stakeholder workgroup on workforce development for community health workers.
14	(b) The workgroup shall study and make recommendations regarding:
15 16	(1) the training and credentialing required for community health workers to be certified as nonclinical health care providers; and
17 18	(2) reimbursement and payment policies for community health workers through the Maryland Medical Assistance Program and private insurers.
19 20 21 22	(c) On or before December 1, 2014, the workgroup shall report its findings and recommendations, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, to the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and Government Operations Committee.
