1 AN ACT concerning

Health Occupations – Maryland Environmental Health Specialists Act – Revisions

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Board of Environmental Health Specialists to adopt $\mathbf{5}$ regulations that include the establishment of a certain seasonal environmental 6 health specialist-in-training program and a certain condition regarding 7 participation in the program; repealing the requirement that the Board, under 8 certain circumstances, reinstate the license of certain licensed environmental 9 health specialists; requiring the Board, under certain circumstances, to place licensed environmental health specialists on inactive or nonrenewed status for a 10 period not to exceed a certain number of years; requiring the Board to provide 11 12certain licensed environmental health specialists with written notification of 13 certain information; requiring the Board, under certain circumstances, to reactivate the license of certain licensed environmental health specialists; and 14generally relating to the Maryland Environmental Health Specialists Act. 15
