CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

Health Occupations – Maryland Environmental Health Specialists Act – Revisions

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Board of Environmental Health Specialists to adopt 4 regulations that include the establishment of a certain seasonal environmental 5 6 health specialist-in-training program and a certain condition regarding 7 participation in the program; repealing the requirement that the Board, under 8 certain circumstances, reinstate the license of certain licensed environmental 9 health specialists; requiring the Board, under certain circumstances, to place 10 licensed environmental health specialists on inactive or nonrenewed status for a 11 period not to exceed a certain number of years; requiring the Board to provide 12 certain licensed environmental health specialists with written notification of 13 certain information; requiring the Board, under certain circumstances, to reactivate the license of certain licensed environmental health specialists; and 14 15 generally relating to the Maryland Environmental Health Specialists Act.
