1 AN ACT concerning

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Children in Out-of-Home Placement – Annual Notice of Benefits

FOR the purpose of requiring the Social Services Administration to provide a certain
child in out-of-home placement certain information at least once a year;
specifying the contents of the information; authorizing the Administration to
provide the information to the child at a certain hearing or by certified mail;
requiring the Secretary of Human Resources to submit a report on the
implementation of this Act to certain committees of the General Assembly by a
certain date; and generally relating to children in out-of-home placement.
