A BILL ENTITLED

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Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems – Mobile Integrated Health Care Services – Study

FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems (MIEMSS) to conduct a certain study on the potential for development of mobile integrated health care services in the State; requiring MIEMSS to submit certain reports to the General Assembly on or before certain dates; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to a study on mobile integrated health care services by the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That:

- (a) The Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems (MIEMSS) shall conduct a study on the potential for development of mobile integrated health care services in the State utilizing emergency medical services providers for community—based preventive, primary, chronic, preadmission, or postadmission health care services, including making recommendations on:
- (1) identification of the types of mobile integrated health care services that could be provided by emergency medical services providers in Maryland and the geographic locations where such services could be provided;
- 21 (2) statutory and regulatory changes that would be required to permit 22 licensed or certified emergency medical services providers to provide mobile integrated 23 health care services;
- 24 (3) applicable federal laws and regulations;

July 1, 2014. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30,

2016, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be

abrogated and of no further force and effect.
