Higher Education - Maryland Technology Internship Program

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Technology Internship Program; 4 establishing certain purposes of the Program; requiring the Shriver Center 5 located at the University of Maryland, Baltimore County to administer the 6 Program and, in collaboration with the Department of Business and Economic 7 Development, undertake certain activities to carry out the purposes of the 8 Program; establishing certain eligibility requirements for participation in the 9 Program; requiring the Shriver Center to develop a process for tracking and assessing certain outcomes; requiring the Shriver Center to obtain feedback 10 from Program participants at certain times; authorizing the use of certain 11 12 awards to reimburse certain businesses for up to a certain percentage of the 13 amount paid to an intern up to a certain amount; requiring the Shriver Center to prepare a certain annual report; requiring the Governor to make an 14 appropriation in the State budget for a certain purpose; defining certain terms; 15 16 and generally relating to the Maryland Technology Internship Program.
