1 AN ACT concerning

2 Frederick County – Alcoholic Beverages – Wine Sampling or Tasting

FOR the purpose of altering a certain restriction on the number of bottles of wine that
may remain open at any one time at a wine sampling or tasting event in
Frederick County; prohibiting a single individual at a wine sampling or tasting
event in the county from consuming more than a certain amount of wine from
all brands in a single day; requiring the Board to adopt certain regulations; and
generally relating to wine sampling or tasting events in Frederick County.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
