Vehicle Laws - Motorcycles - Learners' Instructional Permits

FOR the purpose of requiring an applicant for a learner's instructional permit to operate a motorcycle who does not pass a certain knowledge test to pay a fee established by the Motor Vehicle Administration for each subsequent knowledge test taken by the applicant; altering the expiration date for a certain learner's instructional permit to operate a motorcycle; and generally relating to learners' instructional permits to operate motorcycles.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 18 (a) (1) Any individual who desires to obtain an original driver's license 19 under this subtitle or to be licensed in a class for which the individual is not already 20 licensed under this subtitle shall apply to the Administration for the desired driver's
- 21 license.
- 22 (2) Except as provided in subsection (f) of this section, before issuing a 23 driver's license, the Administration shall issue to each applicant a learner's
- 24 instructional permit. The learner's instructional permit shall identify clearly the class
- of license for which the applicant has applied.

- 4 (ii) The Administration may not issue a learner's instructional 5 permit to an applicant under the age of 16 years if the applicant's school attendance 6 record indicates more than 10 unexcused absences during the prior school semester.
- 7 (4) AN APPLICANT FOR A LEARNER'S INSTRUCTIONAL PERMIT TO 8 OPERATE A MOTORCYCLE WHO DOES NOT PASS THE KNOWLEDGE TEST 9 REQUIRED UNDER REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL 10 PAY A FEE ESTABLISHED BY THE ADMINISTRATION FOR EACH SUBSEQUENT 11 KNOWLEDGE TEST TAKEN BY THE APPLICANT.
- 12 (e) (1) This subsection only applies to an individual who holds a license 13 and who seeks a different class license to drive a motor vehicle that, under the 14 individual's current license, the individual is not authorized to drive.
- 15 (2) The holder of a learner's instructional permit may not take the driver's license examination sooner than 14 days after the permit is issued.
- 17 (3) The 14 days' requirement may be waived if a subsequent learner's instructional permit is issued or applied for.
- 19 (4) A learner's instructional permit issued to an individual described 20 in paragraph (1) of this subsection expires:
- 21 (I) FOR A LEARNER'S INSTRUCTIONAL PERMIT TO 22 OPERATE A MOTORCYCLE, 9 MONTHS AFTER THE DATE OF ISSUANCE; OR
- 23 (II) FOR ANY OTHER LEARNER'S INSTRUCTIONAL PERMIT, 24 180 days after THE date of issuance.
