A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Department of Health and Mental Hygiene – Board of Review – Jurisdiction**

3 FOR the purpose of limiting the jurisdiction of the Board of Review of the Department
4 of Health and Mental Hygiene to hear and determine appeals from decisions of
5 the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene and units in the Department;
6 authorizing the Board to hear and determine any appeal from a decision of the
7 Secretary in a contested case concerning an individual's eligibility for or
8 participation in certain programs; excluding from the Board's review
9 jurisdiction certain Maryland Medical Assistance Program eligibility decisions
10 delegated by the Secretary to the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange; providing
11 that a person aggrieved by a certain adverse determination subject to review by
12 the Board forgo review by the Board and instead petition for judicial review;
13 providing that certain decisions are affirmed if the Board does not issue a
14 decision within a certain period of time after submitting the notice of appeal;
15 providing that any party may seek an appeal from a decision of the Board;
16 repealing certain obsolete provisions of law; requiring the Department to study
17 the continued role of the Board and report its findings and recommendations to
18 the Governor and certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a
19 certain date; making conforming changes; and generally relating to the
20 jurisdiction of the Board of Review of the Department of Health and Mental
21 Hygiene.

7 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
8 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

9 **Article – Health – General**

10 2–206.

11 (a) The Board shall make recommendations to the Secretary on the operation
12 and administration of the Department as the Board considers necessary or desirable.

13 (b) If an advisory board for the Department is not created, the Board shall
14 advise the Secretary on all matters affecting the Department that the Secretary
15 submits to the Board for its consideration.

16 (c) **(1)** Except as [expressly] provided [otherwise] **IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF**
17 **THIS SUBSECTION**, the Board shall hear and determine any appeal from[:

18 (1) A decision of the Secretary or any unit in the Department in a
19 contested case that is subject to judicial review under § 10–222 of the State
20 Government Article;

21 (2) A decision of the Secretary or any unit in the Department that is
22 subject to judicial review under any provision of law other than §§ 10–125 and 10–222
23 of the State Government Article; and

24 (3) An action of or inaction by any unit in the Department for which
25 the Secretary, by rule or regulation, provides for review by the Board.] **A DECISION**
26 **OF THE SECRETARY IN A CONTESTED CASE CONCERNING AN INDIVIDUAL’S**
27 **ELIGIBILITY FOR OR PARTICIPATION IN THE MARYLAND MEDICAL ASSISTANCE**
28 **PROGRAM, INCLUDING HOME- AND COMMUNITY-BASED WAIVER SERVICES**
29 **PROGRAMS AND OTHER DEMONSTRATION WAIVER PROGRAMS.**

30 **(2) MARYLAND MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY**
31 **DECISIONS MADE UNDER DELEGATION BY THE SECRETARY TO THE MARYLAND**
32 **HEALTH BENEFIT EXCHANGE ARE NOT SUBJECT TO REVIEW BY THE BOARD.**

33 (d) The Board shall report at least annually to the Secretary. Its report shall
34 include a summary by categories of appeals heard and determinations made.

1 (e) A Board member may not vote or otherwise participate in the Board's
2 consideration of any matter in which the member has a direct or indirect private
3 interest.

5 (a) If any person is aggrieved by [any] A decision **OF THE SECRETARY**
6 **THAT IS SUBJECT TO REVIEW BY THE BOARD UNDER § 2-206(C)(1) OF THIS**
7 **SUBTITLE**[, action, or inaction on the part of the Secretary or of any unit in the
8 Department for which an appeal to the Board is provided by this subtitle], that person
9 is entitled to appeal as provided in this section.

10 [(b) Except as provided in subsection (e)(2) of this section, before beginning an
11 appeal, the person aggrieved shall make known the basis of the complaint to the
12 individual responsible for the decision, action, or inaction complained of, together with
13 a request for review. If, within 30 days after the request, a resolution satisfactory to
14 the complainant does not occur, the complainant may file a statement of complaint in
15 accordance with subsection (c) of this section.

16 (c) The complainant shall file a detailed written statement of the complaint
17 and all relevant facts and circumstances with the chief executive officer of the
18 Department or unit in the Department to which application for review is made. If
19 there is no chief executive officer, the statement may be filed with any member of the
20 unit's governing body. The complaint shall be acknowledged promptly in writing, and
21 a copy of the complaint and acknowledgment shall be sent to the Secretary.

22 (d) (1) The Department or unit then shall investigate the complaint.
23 Subject to extensions of time to which the parties may agree, the Department or unit
24 shall give a written decision and send a copy of it to the complainant within 30 days
25 after the filing of the complaint.

26 (2) A record shall be kept of each complaint and its disposition. The
27 record shall be open to public inspection during regular business hours.

28 (e) (1) If the matter is one for which an appeal to the Board is provided by
29 this subtitle, a complainant aggrieved by an adverse decision or action or by inaction
30 within the time required by subsection (d) of this section may file an appeal to the
31 Board.

32 (2) Subject to § 10-222 of the State Government Article, any party
33 aggrieved by a decision in a contested case for which an appeal is provided to the
34 Board may appeal directly to the Board.]

35 **(B) ANY APPEAL AUTHORIZED BY THIS SUBTITLE MUST BE FILED WITH**
36 **THE BOARD WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE DATE OF THE DECISION FROM WHICH**
37 **THE APPEAL IS BEING TAKEN.**

1 **[(f)] (C)** (1) The Board shall adopt procedural rules and regulations as
2 provided in the Administrative Procedure Act and in all respects shall be governed by
3 that Act. At least 3 members shall sit at each hearing of the Board when it sits as a
4 board of appeal. Decisions shall be by a majority of the members sitting, shall be in
5 writing, and shall state the Board's reasons. The Board shall keep minutes of its
6 proceedings.

7 (2) A decision of the Board is a final agency decision for purposes of
8 judicial review under the Administrative Procedure Act [or any other law that permits
9 an appeal to the courts from a decision of a unit in the Department].

10 **(3) A PARTY AGGRIEVED BY A DECISION OF THE SECRETARY
11 NEED NOT EXHAUST THE ADMINISTRATIVE REMEDY BEFORE THE BOARD AS
12 PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION AND MAY PETITION FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW OF THE
13 SECRETARY'S DECISION AS A FINAL AGENCY DECISION UNDER THE
14 ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE ACT.**

15 **(4) IF THE BOARD DOES NOT ISSUE A DECISION WITHIN 180 DAYS
16 AFTER SUBMISSION OF THE NOTICE OF APPEAL, THE DECISION OF THE
17 SECRETARY SHALL BE CONSIDERED AFFIRMED.**

18 **[(g)] (D)** (1) As to any issue for which the taking of evidence is
19 authorized, the chairman or the acting chairman may administer oaths and issue
20 subpoenas and orders for the attendance of witnesses and the production of evidence.

21 (2) If a person fails to comply with a lawful order or subpoena issued
22 under this subsection, on the petition of the chairman or acting chairman, a court of
23 competent jurisdiction may compel obedience to the order or subpoena or compel
24 testimony or the production of evidence.

25 **[(h)] (E) (1) [Unless there is a special provision of law governing an
26 appeal of a decision of a particular unit, each appeal] ANY PARTY MAY SEEK AN
27 APPEAL FROM A DECISION OF THE BOARD.**
