A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Transportation - Citizens' Advisory Council for the Baltimore Corridor 3 Transit Study - Red Line

- FOR the purpose of providing that a member of the Citizens' Advisory Council for the
 Baltimore Corridor Transit Study Red Line is entitled to reimbursement of
 expenses under certain State regulations as provided in the State budget;
 clarifying language; and generally relating to the Citizens' Advisory Council for
 the Baltimore Corridor Transit Study Red Line.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
