### 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Vehicle Laws – Historic Motor Vehicles – Camping Trailers

# FOR the purpose of expanding the class of motor vehicles that are eligible for registration as a historic motor vehicle to include a Class G (trailer) camping trailer; and generally relating to registration as a historic motor vehicle.

# 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

# Article – Transportation

14 13–936.2.

(a) In this section, "historic motor vehicle" means a Class E (truck) with a
manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating in excess of 10,000 pounds, Class F
(tractor), CLASS G (TRAILER) CAMPING TRAILER, or a Class M (multipurpose)
motor home that:

19 (1) Is at least 25 years old;

20 (2) Has not been substantially altered from the manufacturer's 21 original design; and

$\frac{1}{2}$	(3) Meets criteria contained in regulations adopted by the Administration.
$\frac{3}{4}$	(b) In this section, "historic motor vehicle" does not include a vehicle that has been remanufactured or reconstructed as a replica of an original vehicle.
$5 \\ 6$	(c) If registered with the Administration under this section, every historic motor vehicle is a Class L (historic) vehicle.
$7 \\ 8$	(d) Except as provided in subsection (i) of this section, for each Class L (historic) vehicle, the annual registration fee is \$25.50.
$9\\10$	(e) (1) A historic motor vehicle registered under this section may not be used for:
11	(i) General daily transportation; or
$\begin{array}{c} 12 \\ 13 \end{array}$	(ii) Any commercial transportation of passengers or property on highways.
$\begin{array}{c} 14\\ 15\\ 16\end{array}$	(2) In applying for registration of a historic motor vehicle under this section, the owner of the vehicle shall submit with the application a certification that the vehicle for which the application is made:
$\begin{array}{c} 17 \\ 18 \end{array}$	(i) Will be maintained for use in exhibitions, club activities, parades, tours, and similar uses;
19	(ii) Will not be used for:
20	1. General daily transportation; or

$\frac{23}{24}$	(iii) Is insured by a historic vehicle, a show vehicle, or an antique vehicle insurance policy.
$25 \\ 26 \\ 27$	(f) Except as provided in § 13–936.1 of this subtitle, on registration of a vehicle under the section, the Administration shall issue a special, historic motor vehicle registration plate of the size and design that the Administration determines.
28 29 30 31	(g) Unless the presence of the equipment was specifically required by a statute of this State as a condition of sale when the vehicle was manufactured, the presence of any specific equipment is not required for the operation of a vehicle registered under this section.

#### HOUSE BILL 1553

1 (h) (1) A vehicle registered under this section is exempt from any statute 2 that requires periodic vehicle inspections or that requires the use and inspection of 3 emission controls.

4 (2) Paragraph (1) of this subsection may not be construed to limit the 5 authority of a police officer to issue a safety equipment repair order for defective 6 equipment under § 23–105 of this article.

7 (i) (1) For a motor vehicle manufactured at least 60 years prior to the 8 current model year, there is a onetime registration fee of \$50.00.

9 (2) Registration of a motor vehicle described in paragraph (1) of this 10 subsection is not transferable to a subsequent owner.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2014.
