## Conowingo Dam - Sediment - Dredging

FOR the purpose of urging the United States Congress to authorize and fund a certain project to dredge behind the Conowingo Dam for a certain purpose; providing that a copy of this resolution be forwarded by the Department of Legislative Services to certain individuals; and generally relating to the Conowingo Dam.

WHEREAS, The Chesapeake Bay is a national treasure constituting the largest estuary in the United States and one of the largest and most biologically productive estuaries in the world; and

WHEREAS, The Conowingo Dam on the Susquehanna River plays an important ecological role in retaining sediment and other pollutants that would otherwise enter the Bay; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Geological Survey estimates the reservoir of the Conowingo Dam will completely fill with sediment in the next 15 to 20 years, causing the flow of sediment past the dam to more than double to almost 3.3 million tons annually; and

WHEREAS, A study of pollution releases over the dam suggests that the Bay is already seeing damaging effects from the loss of reservoir sediment storage capacity behind the Conowingo Dam; and

WHEREAS, Failing to address increased nutrient and sediment loads from the Conowingo Dam would significantly undermine the State's efforts to meet the requirements of the multistate pollution diet for the Bay, known as the Chesapeake Bay Total Maximum Daily Load; and

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the General Assembly urges the United States Congress to authorize and fully fund a project by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to dredge sediment behind the Conowingo Dam in order to preserve the dam's capability to block pollutants in the Susquehanna River from reaching the Chesapeake Bay; and be it further
