- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 (a) In this article the following words have the meanings indicated unless a 21 different meaning is clearly intended from the context.
- 22 (q) "Disabled" means having a temporary or permanent physical disability.

- 2 IF A DISABLED VOTER IS IN A WAITING LINE TO VOTE, AN ELECTION 3 JUDGE, TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, SHALL:
- 4 (1) DESIGNATE ANOTHER VOTER IN THE WAITING LINE TO SERVE
- 5 AS A PLACEHOLDER AND ALLOW THE DISABLED VOTER TO SIT UNTIL THE
- 6 PLACEHOLDER REACHES THE CHECK-IN JUDGE; OR
- 7 (2) MOVE THE DISABLED VOTER TO THE FRONT OF THE WAITING
- 8 LINE.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 10 June 1, 2014.
