Vehicle Laws – Size, Weight, and Axle Load Limits

3 FOR the purpose of exempting certain vehicles engaged in emergency operations or in 4 snow or ice removal from certain provisions of law governing size, weight, and $\mathbf{5}$ axle load limits; repealing a certain provision of law that authorizes the State 6 Highway Administration to issue limited duration special vehicle permits in 7 exceptional cases of vehicles exceeding size or weight limits; making this Act an 8 emergency measure; and generally relating to vehicle size, weight, and axle load 9 limits.
