17 (1) The juvenile counselor shall visit the child at the child's placement 18 no less than once every month, if the placement is in the State;

1(I)THE CHILD IS PLACED AT A FACILITY OPERATED BY THE2DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE SERVICES; AND

3 (II) AT LEAST ONE VISIT WITHIN EVERY 3 MONTH PERIOD IS 4 CONDUCTED IN PERSON;

5 (3) The court may order the juvenile counselor to visit the child more 6 frequently than required by item (1) of this section if the court deems it to be in the 7 child's best interests; and

8 [(3)] (4) The court may require the custodian to file periodic written 9 progress reports, with recommendations for further supervision, treatment, or 10 rehabilitation.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2014.
