## Commercial Law – Interference With Internet Ticket Sales – Prohibition

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from intentionally selling or using certain 4 software to circumvent a security measure, an access control system, or any 5 other control or measure on a certain Web site that is used to ensure an 6 equitable ticket buying process; providing that a violation of this Act is an 7 unfair or deceptive trade practice under the Maryland Consumer Protection Act 8 and is subject to certain enforcement and penalty provisions; defining certain
