SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages

(9-1) "Hard cider" means a beverage derived primarily from [apples or]
APPLES, apple concentrate and water, PEARS, OR PEAR CONCENTRATE AND

- 2 less than 7% of alcohol by volume.
