9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 10 MARYLAND, That:

The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on 11 (1)behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland 1213Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2014 in the total principal amount of \$1,166,065,000 \$1,179,615,377 \$1,180,515,377. This loan shall be evidenced by the 14issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a 15resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance 16with §§ 8-117 through 8-124 and 8-131.2 of the State Finance and Procurement 17Article. 18

19 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold 20 as a single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

(3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable architects' and engineers' fees:
