A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2014,**
3 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009,**
4 **2010, 2011, 2012, and 2013**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of One
6 Billion, One Hundred Sixty–Six Million, Sixty–Five Thousand Dollars
7 (\$1,166,065,000), the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building,
8 construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and
9 capital equipment purchases of the State, for acquiring certain real estate in
10 connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other
11 organizations for certain development and improvement purposes, subject to
12 certain requirements that certain matching funds be provided and expended by
13 certain dates; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing
14 the loan; authorizing the creation of State Debt in certain years to be used for
15 certain purposes; authorizing certain Aging Schools Program funds to be
16 distributed as certain grants to certain nonpublic schools that meet certain
17 criteria; requiring the Maryland State Department of Education and the
18 Interagency Committee on School Construction to administer certain grants to
19 certain nonpublic schools; providing for certain restricted purposes for certain
20 Program Open Space funds; requiring that certain funds be administered in
21 accordance with certain provisions of law; requiring notification to the General
22 Assembly under certain circumstances; providing that certain funds needed for
23 the State’s share of certain costs be provided as split authorizations for certain
24 fiscal years; imposing a certain tax on all assessable property in the State;
25 requiring that certain grantees convey certain easements under certain
26 circumstances to the Maryland Historical Trust; providing that the proceeds of
27 certain loans must be expended or encumbered by a certain date; authorizing
28 certain unexpended appropriations in certain prior capital budgets and bond
29 loans to be expended for other public projects; altering certain requirements for
30 certain programs in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans; providing that
31 the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans

31 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
32 MARYLAND, That:

33 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
34 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland
35 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2014 in the total principal amount of
36 \$1,166,065,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of
37 State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works

1 and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 and
2 8–131.2 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

3 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold
4 as a single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

5 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer
6 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and
7 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then
8 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the
9 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable
