A BILL ENTITLED

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Task Force to Study Access to Pharmacy Services in Maryland

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study Access to Pharmacy Services 4 in Maryland; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task 5 Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain 6 compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; 7 requiring the Task Force to study and make recommendations regarding certain 8 matters; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to 9 the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House, and 10 certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date: 11 providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study Access to Pharmacy Services in Maryland. 12
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:
 - (a) There is a Task Force to Study Access to Pharmacy Services in Maryland.

22	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

June 1, 2014. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June 30, 2015, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this

Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
