

# SENATE BILL 257

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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Task Force to Study Access to Pharmacy Services in Maryland**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study Access to Pharmacy Services  
4 in Maryland; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task  
5 Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain  
6 compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses;  
7 requiring the Task Force to study and make recommendations regarding certain  
8 matters; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to  
9 the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House, and  
10 certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date;  
11 providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task  
12 Force to Study Access to Pharmacy Services in Maryland.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
14 MARYLAND, That:

15 (a) There is a Task Force to Study Access to Pharmacy Services in Maryland.

16 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:

17 (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the  
18 President of the Senate;

19 (2) two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker  
20 of the House;

21 (3) one member of the State Board of Pharmacy, appointed by the  
22 Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene;

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EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

1                   (4)    one member of the State Board of Physicians, appointed by the  
2 Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene;

3                   (5)    one representative of the Maryland Medical Assistance Program,  
4 appointed by the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene; and

5                   (6)    the following members, appointed by the Governor:

6                   (i)    one representative of the Maryland Society of Health System  
7 Pharmacies;

8                   (ii)   one representative of the Maryland Pharmacists  
9 Association;

10                  (iii)  one representative of the National Association of Chain  
11 Drug Stores;

12                  (iv)   one representative of the Maryland Hospital Association;

13                  (v)    one representative of MedChi, The Maryland State Medical  
14 Society;

15                  (vi)   one representative of the Maryland Chapter of the Society of  
16 Hospital Medicine;

17                  (vii)  one representative of the mobility unit of the Maryland  
18 Transit Administration; and

19                  (viii) one consumer member.

20                  (c)    The Governor shall designate the chair of the Task Force.

21                  (d)    The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall provide staff for the  
22 Task Force.

23                  (e)    A member of the Task Force:

24                   (1)    may not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force; but

25                   (2)    is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard  
26 State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

27                  (f)    The Task Force shall:

28                   (1)    study the availability of pharmacy services for patients when they  
29 are discharged from the hospital;

1           (2)    identify any barriers or obstacles facing patients when they are  
2 discharged from the hospital that may prevent them from filling prescription orders;

3           (3)    compile best practices used around the State to facilitate access to  
4 pharmacy services;

5           (4)    explore transition of care and care coordination efforts by hospital  
6 staff and direct acute care pharmacists that connect patients with needed pharmacy  
7 services after discharge from the hospital;

8           (5)    consider geographic differences in the State relating to access to  
9 pharmacy services;

10          (6)    receive public testimony from stakeholders and the public;

11          (7)    recommend strategies to reduce disparities in access to pharmacy  
12 services; and

13          (8)    recommend the adoption of regulations by the Department of  
14 Health and Mental Hygiene that are consistent with the efforts of the State to  
15 redesign the State's Medicare waiver.

16          (g)    On or before June 1, 2015, the Task Force shall report its findings and  
17 recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State  
18 Government Article, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of  
19 Delegates, the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, the Senate Finance  
20 Committee, the House Appropriations Committee, and the House Health and  
21 Government Operations Committee.

22          SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
23 June 1, 2014. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the  
24 end of June 30, 2015, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this  
25 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
