WITHIN THE STATE.

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THE COMMISSION HAS JURISDICTION OVER AND MAY ENFORCE THIS
TITLE AND ANY REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER IT TO THE SAME EXTENT AND IN
THE SAME MANNER AS ANY PROVISIONS OF DIVISION I OF THE PUBLIC
UTILITIES ARTICLE, AS PROVIDED IN TITLE 13 OF THE PUBLIC UTILITIES
ARTICLE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, in order to protect public safety, it is the intent of the General Assembly that the best available technology be used for the inspection of gas pipelines located within the State.

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SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 4 October 1, 2014.
