1 (d) (1) (i) A regulated lobbyist who is required to register under 2 subsection (a) of this section shall report the total cost of the meal or reception, 3 including the identity of any sponsor who contributes to the cost and the amount of the 4 contribution, to the Ethics Commission within 14 days after the date of the meal or 5 reception.

6 (ii) Notwithstanding the provisions of subparagraph (i) of this 7 paragraph, if any information required under subparagraph (i) is not known within 14 8 days after the date of the meal or reception, the regulated lobbyist shall, as to the 9 information not known, specify the nature and estimate the amount of each item.

10 (2) If all of the information required by paragraph (1)(i) of this 11 subsection is reported accurately and completely, the regulated lobbyist is not required 12 to report the cost of the meal or reception under § 15–704(b)(2)(vii) of this subtitle.

13 (3) The State Ethics Commission shall allow public inspection of any
 14 registration report required under this subsection during regular business hours.
