1 [(i)] (1) hold a tip jar license or wholesaler's license or be 2 employed by a person who holds a tip jar license or wholesaler's license; or

3 [(ii)] (2) hold an ownership interest in or receive a direct 4 benefit from a person who holds a tip jar license or wholesaler's license.

5 [(2) If a member of the gaming commission serves on the board of 6 directors or as an officer of an organization and that organization applies for funds 7 from the gaming commission, the member shall cease immediately to serve on the 8 gaming commission.]

9 (F) THE GAMING COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT CONFLICT OF INTEREST 10 REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO MEMBERS OF THE GAMING COMMISSION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2014.
