1 WHEREAS, The Baltimore Metropolitan Council (BMC) was created by the 2 General Assembly in 1992 out of its predecessor agency, the Baltimore Regional 3 Council of Governments; and

4 WHEREAS, Federal law requires a metropolitan planning organization to 5 develop long-range transportation plans and transportation improvement programs 6 through a performance-driven, outcome-based approach to planning for metropolitan 7 areas of the State; and

8 WHEREAS, Federal law requires a metropolitan planning organization to 9 consist of local elected officials, officials of public agencies that administer or operate 10 major modes of transportation in the metropolitan area, and appropriate State 11 officials; and

12 WHEREAS, State law authorizes the BMC to serve, with the State Department 13 of Transportation, as a metropolitan planning organization for federal funding and 14 certification; and

WHEREAS, The BMC created the Baltimore Region Transportation Board inthe BMC bylaws to serve as the designated metropolitan planning organization; and

WHEREAS, There is a need for the local governments in the BMC, appropriate
State agencies, and other organizations interested in the advancement of the
Baltimore region to work more cooperatively to achieve important economic
development, transportation, and planning requirements and goals; now, therefore,
