- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State to maintain certain cemeteries in accordance 4 with a certain definition; making certain provisions of State law that apply to 5 property of cemeteries also apply to a cemetery owned by the State and located 6 on the grounds of a State facility; requiring the Department of Health and 7 Mental Hygiene, beginning on a certain date and annually thereafter, to report 8 on the implementation of certain provisions to certain legislative committees; 9 altering a certain definition; making a conforming change; and generally relating to cemeteries owned by the State and located on the grounds of a State 10 facility. 11

- 2 1 An alley, canal, road, or other public thoroughfare may not be opened 2 through property of a cemetery if that property is used or to be used for burial. 3 (b) This section does not authorize a registered cemeterian, permit holder, or 4 other person to obstruct: 5 (1) a public road in use when the cemetery is formed; or 6 the site of a future public road that, when the cemetery is formed, 7 is shown on a plat made by authority of the State, a county, or a municipal 8 corporation. 9 5-601. 10 In this subtitle, "perpetual care": means the maintenance, including the cutting of grass abutting 11 (1) 12memorials or monuments, administration, supervision, and embellishment of a 13 cemetery and its grounds, roads, and paths; and 14 includes the repair and renewal of buildings, including columbaria 15 and mausoleums, and the property of the cemetery. Article - State Finance and Procurement 16 17 10 - 309.In this section, "State facility" means: 18 (a) 19 (1) a facility maintained by the Mental Hygiene Administration of the 20 Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and listed in § 10–406 of the Health – 21General Article; [or] 22a State residential center for individuals with an intellectual disability in the Developmental Disabilities Administration of the Department of 2324Health and Mental Hygiene; AND 25**(3)** THE FORMER CROWNSVILLE HOSPITAL CENTER.
- 26 A cemetery owned by the State and located on the grounds of a State 27facility may not be sold by the State if the State facility is downsized, consolidated, closed, or sold. 28
  - A cemetery owned by the State AND LOCATED ON THE GROUNDS OF A STATE FACILITY shall be maintained by the State, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE DEFINITION OF PERPETUAL CARE UNDER § 5-601 OF THE BUSINESS

REGULATION ARTICLE, and marked with a monument commemorating the individuals interred in the cemetery.

- (d) Any easement or right of entry to a cemetery owned by the State and located on the grounds of a State facility that has been recorded among the land records of the county where the cemetery is located on or before October 1, 2004 may not be transferred or sold.
- 7 (e) Notwithstanding subsections (b) and (d) of this section, a cemetery or an 8 easement or right of entry to a cemetery owned by the State and located on the 9 grounds of a State facility may be sold by the State if the deed for the property 10 includes a restrictive covenant requiring the owner and any future owner to maintain 11 the cemetery as provided under subsection (c) of this section.
- 12 (F) THE PROVISIONS OF § 5–502 OF THE BUSINESS REGULATION
  13 ARTICLE APPLY TO A CEMETERY OWNED BY THE STATE AND LOCATED ON THE
  14 GROUNDS OF A STATE FACILITY.
