<u>Health Occupations –</u> Child Abuse and Neglect – Failure to Report and Training

4 FOR the purpose of requiring an agency that is participating in a child abuse or neglect investigation and that has reasonable grounds to believe that a person $\mathbf{5}$ 6 has failed to report child abuse as required under a certain provision of law to 7 file a certain complaint with a certain board, agency, institution, or facility; requiring each health occupation board authorized to issue a license or 8 9 certificate to adopt certain regulations regarding training on the identification 10 and reporting of child abuse and neglect; specifying certain requirements for the 11 child abuse and neglect training; requiring each health occupation board to 12 establish a certain process for obtaining certification that certain courses satisfy 13certain training requirements; specifying certain sanctions for a violation of a certain regulation adopted by a health occupation board; establishing that this 14 15Act does not affect certain other disciplinary actions of a health occupation board authorized under other provisions; requiring each health occupation 16 17board to submit a certain annual statistical report to the Secretary of Health 18 and Mental Hygiene; requiring the Secretary to compile certain information and 19submit a certain annual report to the General Assembly; defining certain terms; 20and generally relating to child abuse and neglect.

(G) (1) EACH YEAR, EACH HEALTH OCCUPATION BOARD SHALL
 SUBMIT A STATISTICAL REPORT TO THE SECRETARY, INDICATING THE NUMBER
 OF INDIVIDUALS, AND SPECIFYING THEIR PROFESSIONS, WHO:

6 STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31 OF EACH YEAR.
